

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



Here's the short summary: I can now say that in 25 years of first aid (including advanced life support and remote area training) ... this is the best course I've ever done, bar none.

Simon Ritson's content is the most up-to-date by international standards, meets and exceeds NZ standards, and really is the new standard.

For those who want the details that sit behind it, the course had five main strengths:

Theory: this was the most up-to-date information, and all evidence-based. (And not to burst anyone's bubbles, but that's not the case for St Johns or even NZQA standards ...)

Imagery: Where other courses will show well-lit, staged images of models in nice clothes and small dollop of tomato sauce, we saw real photos from real events – including videos of physical trauma occurring in real time. This was far more effective for building the neural pathways of both being taken by surprise, noticing one's own personal 'witness shock', and then getting ready to respond – just as happens in real life. (And is the same kind of approach we use for training military and elite athletes … but generally not in mainstream first aid.)


Practical: We were then straight into practical scenarios, for each issue, whether with a partner, in groups, or using realistic training prosthetics. This is the most hands-on course I've done. Hearing the theory of packing wounds and seeing a sanitised picture is nothing compared to actually having to pack a fake wound that is simulating arterial bleeding ... we were literally 'under the pump'! I've always thought that a first aid course that doesn't make one's heart rate increase just a bit probably doesn't really reflect reality ...

Tools and tech: We used the best, latest, and evidence-based in modern first aid equipment. Personally, these are items I've carried for years. They're standard for police, ambos, paramedics, and in military contexts. But they're rarely discussed in lowest-common-denominator first aid. If FA courses in 2021 don't include the use of TQs, rescue hooks, HyFins, Israeli Bandages / Emergency Bandages, trauma blankets, and SAM Splints ... then they're 20 years out of date for the theory, practice, and tools.

Encouragement, motivation, and belief: First aid is yukky. I've done a lot of it, and I don't like doing it. It can cause trauma. Simon gets that, acknowledges it, and gives the encouragement to still get back on the horse. In 25 years, he is also the first trainer to offer a challenge at the end of the course – set aside regular time and practice. This course is therefore not just a yearly tick-a-box exercise for organisations doing 'safety theatre compliance', and staff who are only going because they are made to. This course builds real responders. He also offers to people to call or email him personally with questions after the course … again in 25 years, no other trainer has offered that. This is customer service above and beyond.


